


Baby Bibs and Bumpers

Baby Bib Instructions

Items you will need:

Fibrous water soluble stabilizer

Fabric for the front of the bib-this piece should be 1" longer and 1" wider than the finished size of the bib design.

Fabric for the back of the bib-this piece should be 1" longer and 1" wider than the finished size of the bib design.

Fabric spray adhesive

Note: Wind bobbin with the top thread you will be using for the bib outline column.

Note: The outline and tackdown color changes are for the fabric area of the design. The outline is a running stitch that defines the 8" x 10" bib shape. Your piece of fabric should be a little bigger than the outline, approx. 10" x 12". The tack-down is a running stitch line that will stitch the outline to tack down the fabric. Trim the fabric close to the tackdown stitches.

1. Embroider your design on the bib fabric. Hoop to the lower part of the material.



2. Hoop two pieces of fibrous water soluble stabilizer.



3. Stitch the first color change of the bib; this is your outline for the fabric you previously embroidered.

4. Tape or adhere the fabric with a light spray of adhesive with the embroidery design lining up for proper bib placement. Also spray or tape a matching piece of fabric to the back, using the outline as a reference. (we recommend tape on the back of the hoop fabric)




5. Stitch the second color change; which is the tack down stitch.



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6. Remove the hoop from the machine.
7. Trim fabric on the outside of the tack down stitches. Do this to the front and back.



8. Embroider the rest of the design.



9. Remove from the hoop.
10. Trim the stabilizer close to the fabric.
11. Use a small brush or Q-tip to apply water to dissolve the water soluble stabilizer.
12. Add Velcro or ribbon to the bib for closure.
13. Your bib is now complete!
