Scrapbook Stitches Collection Project Instructions





Beach Bag





Embroider on Paper



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Apron

For this project, you will need:

- Apron or pattern and items listed to make an apron
- · Cut-away stabilizer
- Chalk wheel
- Designs Apron (top of apron) and CH2955 (two above pocket)
- 1. Mark center of the design(s) with the chalk wheel.
- 2. Hoop apron with two pieces of cut-away stabilizer.
- 3. Embroider design(s).
- 4. Remove from hoop.
- 5. Trim cut-away stabilizer close to design(*s*).
- 6. Press apron.

Beach Bag

For this project, you will need:

- Beach bag or pattern and items listed to make a beach bag
- Cut-away stabilizer
- Chalk wheel
- Designs CH2960

Note: You may have to open a side seam before you embroider the design.

- 1. Mark center of the design with the chalk wheel.
- 2. Hoop beach bag with two pieces of cut-away stabilizer.
- 3. Embroider design.
- 4. Remove from hoop.
- 5. Trim cut-away stabilizer close to design.









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Computer Pocket

For this project, you will need:

- 2 14" x 18" Pieces of fabric for the front (We used circle print.)
- 2 22" x 18" Pieces of fabric for the back/flap (We used gold.)
- 102" x 2" Piece of fabric for the binding *(We used rust.)* or 102" of packaged binding
- 2 Pieces of light weight quilt batting 1 piece 14" x 18" and 1 piece 22" x 18"
- Cut-away stabilizer
- (Velcro)
- Chalk wheel
- Designs HY0766 and SUNFL
- Note: Wind bobbins with coordinating thread when embroidery on back of the embroidery will show.
- 1. Mark the center of the design in the bottom right corner of the 22" x 18" piece of fabric.
- 2. Hoop the fabric with two pieces of cut-away stabilizer.

- 3. Embroider design.
- 4. Remove from hoop.
- 5. Trim stabilizer close to design.
- 6. For the back/flap pieces of fabric: layer the bottom piece of fabric with the back of the fabric up, the quilt batting, and the embroidered piece front side up.
- 7. Quilt the fabric with design SUNFL
- 8. For the front pieces of fabric: layer the bottom piece of fabric with the back of the fabric up, the quilt batting, and the top piece front side up.
- 9. Quilt the fabric with design SUNFL
- 10. Bind the top of the front piece.
- 11. Place the front piece on the back/flap piece with the back pieces together.
- 12. Bind the flap and the two pieces together.











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Embroider on Paper

For this project, you will need:

- Cut-away stabilizer
- Double stick tape or spray adhesive
- Chalk check on the back of the paper to make sure the chalk can be brushed away
- 1. Mark the center of the design on paper.
- 2. Hoop two pieces of cut-away stabilizer.
- 3. Spray the adhesive on the cut-away not the paper or apply double stick tape on the cut-away.
- 4. Lay the paper on the backing
- 5. Embroider design.
- 6. Remove from hoop.
- 7. Gently pull the cut-away stabilizer from the paper. Trim stabilizer close to design

Suggestions:

• Precut the paper you will embroider. We have had better luck with placing the design in the right area.

- Use scraps when you are going to tear the edges around the design.
- I suggest using paper without the white core; it looks like bobbin pulling up even if you are using coordinating bobbin thread.
- I have had better luck with the cut-away stabilizer; the tear-away does not give the paper enough support for the stitches.
- Use the largest hoop you have available; the paper lays flatter on the stabilizer without the raised areas near the hoop.













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Grandma's Garden

For this project, you will need:

- 8" x 6" Piece of fabric for the center (We used orange.)
- 32" x 2" Piece of fabric for the strip around the center (*We used floral*.)
- 8" x 10" Piece of fabric for the back (We used yellow/orange.)
- 40" x 2" Piece of fabric for the binding (We used yellow/orange.) or 40" of packaged binding
- 8" x 10" Piece of light weight quilt batting
- 20" Piece of ribbon
- · Cut-away stabilizer
- Chalk wheel
- Designs CH2959 and CH2957

Note: Add lettering to design if desired. Wind bobbins with coordinating thread when embroidery on back of the embroidery will show.

- 1. Mark the center of the 6" x 8" of fabric.
- 2. Hoop fabric with two pieces of cut-away stabilizer.
- 3. Embroider design.
- 4. Remove from hoop.
- 5. Trim cut-away stabilizer close to design.
- 6. Stitch the 2" strips to the embroidered piece of fabric. Press.
- 7. Layer the bottom piece of fabric with the back of the fabric up, the quilt batting, and the embroidered piece front side up. Bind the edges.
- 8. Add CH2957 (frog).
- 9. Add ribbon to the corners.











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Pencil Holder

For this project, you will need:

- 2 6" x 10" Pieces of fabric
- 9" Zipper
- Cut-away stabilizer
- · Chalk wheel
- Designs HY0765
- 1. Mark the center of the design on the 6" x 10" piece of fabric.

- 2. Hoop the fabric with two pieces of cut-away stabilizer.
- 3. Embroider design.
- 4. Remove from hoop.
- 5. Trim stabilizer close to design.
- 6. Stitch zipper in the top pieces of fabric.
- 7. Place right sides together. Stitch sides and bottom together.









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Note: Wind bobbins with coordinating thread when embroidery on back of the embroidery will show. Seam allowance is ½".

- 1. Stitch #1 through #3 strips to the 6" x 6" piece of fabric. Press.
- 2. Layer the bottom piece of fabric with the back of the fabric up, the quilt batting, and the quilted piece front side up. Bind the edges.
- 3. Hoop the quilted piece of fabric. Embroider XM1506. We embroidered the design twice in opposite corners to the embroidered piece of fabric.
- 4. Add crystals.

Quilted Table Topper

For this project, you will need:

- 6" x 6" Piece of fabric for the center (We used blue.)
- 28" x 2" Piece of fabric for the strip #1 (We used floral.)
- 36" x 2" Piece of fabric for the strip #2 (We used dark blue.)
- 44" x 2" Piece of fabric for the strip #3 (We used paisley print.)
- 12" x 12" Piece of fabric for the back (We used dark blue.)
- 52" x 2" Piece of fabric for the binding (We used dark blue.) or 52" of packaged binding
- 12" x 12" Piece of light weight quilt batting
- Chalk wheel
- Designs XM1506
- Crystals





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- 2. Mark center of the area between the chalk lines.
- 3. Hoop fabric with two pieces of cut-away stabilizer.
- 4. Embroider design.
- 5. Remove from hoop.
- 6. Trim cut-away stabilizer close to design.
- 7. Fold the 12" edges in ¼" with back of fabric together. Stitch edges down.
- 8. Fold the short edges in 8½" with front sides together. Stitch the top on bottom with ¼" seam.
- 9. Fold right sides out. Edge stitch the top and bottom area between the pockets.
- 10. Press. Insert 3-ring binder.

Recipe Holder

For this project, you will need:

- 8½" X 11"-1 inch deep 3-Ring binder
- Plastic pockets for the recipes
- 40" x 12" Piece of fabric
- Cut-away stabilizer
- Chalk wheel
- Designs FL1618

Note: Add lettering to design if desired.

1. With fabric front side up mark 9" and 19" from the right edge with chalk wheel.





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
